


SESSION HIGHLIGHTS – AUGUST 2022



The Mission Committee is so THANKFUL to everyone who donated items, organized, and was on the set-up and clean-up teams for the Annual Yard Sale. It was a huge success! We brought in \$2,300.00 that will go towards Lake Huron Woods building campaign for senior citizens and our local associations for the homeless. A special THANK YOU to Sue Murvich for taking charge and

putting in too many hours of work to count – you are a blessing! The Mission Committee has also received word from our contact in Costa Rica that we would like to share with you:

Dear Janet and friends in Port Huron,

Greetings from Costa Rica, where my household is recovering from Covid. This is the second time around for my husband, Javier, and me. For Miguel España, our houseguest who is in exile from Nicaragua, this was his first experience with the virus. I am glad to report that all of us had relatively minor symptoms and we hope to be able to resume our normal activities soon.

Thank you so much for writing to me. I apologize for not writing sooner. I have been carefully reconsidering my plans to travel in the United States for the months of September and October. In consultation with folks here at the Latin American Biblical University and with World Mission, I have decided to postpone my mission interpretation assignment until next fall.

In October, the Latin American Biblical University is celebrating one hundred years of offering theological education here in Costa Rica. We are planning several events in the coming months. The leadership team was never in agreement with the idea of my being away for two months this year. My colleagues urged me to reconsider.

I also admit that I am worried about the rising costs of travel within the United States, given that Presbyterian World Mission does not cover the cost for mission co-workers to visit churches. From news reports, I understand that the airlines say their flight schedules should be more reliable after Labor Day, but right now travel sounds very chaotic. I also want to think very carefully with you about how to do my mission interpretation assignment with as low a carbon footprint as possible.

Now Covid has complicated our lives a bit more. Javier was scheduled to have surgery on July 6th to repair a large hernia. Now that surgery has been postponed until mid-August, which means he will not be fully healed by the beginning of September. I am very sorry that I will not be with you in person soon. I do hope, very much, that we can connect virtually sometime soon. Can you invite me to a mission committee meeting or a Sunday School class in the coming weeks? I hope we can use the months ahead to plan well for a visit next year.

We are also planning to have an online event in English to invite you to celebrate the one-hundredth anniversary of the Latin American Biblical University with us. We hope to share with you how the theological education you help to support is impacting the lives of women and men throughout the region. I will be in touch soon with more information.

I look forward to hearing from you very soon.
