

### PASTOR'S POINT, MARCH 2022

March marks the two-year anniversary of the Pandemic. It has brought not only grief for so many who have died, but also the debilitating effects of many "long-haulers" who are fighting the physical effects of having had Covid 19. The mental health issues are evident which have sprung up from two years of stress

and strain, not only on us as human beings but also on the brokenness of our communities, our nation and our world.

### One Great Hour of Sharing

For over 70 years, One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) has provided Presbyterians a way to share God's love with neighbors in need around the world. The three programs supported by OGHS — Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, the Presbyterian Hunger Program and Self Development of People — all work in different ways to serve individuals and communities in need. From initial disaster response

to ongoing community development, their work fits together to provide people with safety, sustenance, and hope.

Not interested in using the Tithe.ly application but would like to make giving easier? Please feel free to contact the office to get signed up for automated giving. We use Hubbard Press as a third party to process these donations. It's safe and convenient. Members can also set up a recurring donation to the church using their online banking program (be sure to check with your bank to see if there are any fees involved).

### ASH WEDNESDAY, MARCH 2, 2022

On Ash Wednesday we are beginning Lent in a more meditative, personal way. We will NOT be having a Worship Service at 7:00 p.m. as previously

advertised. Instead, we will open the sanctuary from 4:00 to 8:00 p.m. on Ash Wednesday, March 2<sup>nd</sup> for each of you to come into the sanctuary, at your convenience, for some personal time of reflection and meditation; a good start to the Lenten Season of self-examination. Between the hours of 4:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m., you are invited to stay as long as you want. There will be meditative and devotional materials available to you and ashes (with an explanation of their significance) will be on the Communion Table. Please take advantage of this opportunity to prepare for the Lenten season of 40 days, not counting Sundays, which leads us to Easter, the Celebration of Jesus' Resurrection.

### PASTOR NOMINATING COMMITTEE

This is an update on the process to choose a Called Pastor for the future of First Presbyterian Church, Port Huron. We have received from many of you, suggestions for the seven members who will make up the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). After much intense work by the PNC, probably over a period of one year, they will bring their recommendation of who should be the "Called Pastor" for First Presbyterian Church, Port Huron.

However, before the PNC begins its work, the people for the PNC must be chosen by a vote of the congregation at a Special Congregation Meeting which will probably happen within the next month or so.

At the Session's next meeting (March 14) the Session will vote on who will sit on the 5-member Selection Committee. Their job will be to recommend the 7-member Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) and to present their slate to the congregation for a vote at a Special Congregational Meeting; the date of that Special Congregational Meeting will be set by the Session.

As we move into this process, Wendy Beck, our Presbytery of Detroit Liaison Person, will come to speak with the Session and then do a follow-up visit at the first meeting of the PNC once they have been chosen and are meeting for the first time. Once the PNC is formulated and starts its work, Pastor Roxie will have no influence or input into that process except to answer questions as to where to go for information and help in the PNC process.



Now if I (Pastor Roxie) have just "muddied the water" for you, please come to the information class that I will lead on March 6<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. on "Presbyterianism 101: The Structure and Governance of the Presbyterian Church U.S.A." The emphasis will be on how the structure of being Presbyterian impacts the ministry at FPC Port Huron.


