## PASTOR'S POINT

*From the desk of:*

**Pastor Roxie Davis**

In the past few weeks, I have begun the worship service with these words: "We don't come **to** the church but we **are** the church and we gather here—in this beautiful building or through the internet—to worship God, give praise to our Maker, recognize Christ's role in our lives and join together to do ministry as the Body of Christ.

As many of you know, we are in a Preaching Series called "The Hands and Feet of Jesus" and an Adult Class called, "The Hands and Feet of Jesus in the Community," where some of our community leaders tell us about their ministries and then give us ideas as to how we can empower their ministries. It is part of working, "for the common good."

In this Newsletter you will find a section that says: "The

Hands and Feet of Jesus" with church opportunities for you to enact those words through your talent, time, or treasure. Please think and prayer earnestly about how you might help in any of those areas. We are the Body of Christ and we need all the parts functioning in their special area of ministry.

HUNGER • DISASTER • DEVELOPMENT

For over 70 years, One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) has provided Presbyterians a way to share God's love with neighbors in need around the world. The three programs supported by OGHS – Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, the Presbyterian Hunger Program and Self Development of People – all work in different ways to serve individuals and communities in need. From initial disaster response to ongoing community development, their work fits together to provide people with safety, sustenance and hope.

For many years the OGHS has provided "Fish Offering Boxes" to be used as a way to help children focus on the mission of OGHS and teach them the joy of giving. The Fish Offering Boxes will be handed out to the children on February 26, the first Sunday after Ash Wednesday. The boxes will be collected on Palm Sunday, April 2. On that Sunday, One Great Hour of Sharing envelopes will be provided to the adults in the congregation so they too can serve this mission.

## **FUNERAL:**

You are needed in this ministry. When someone goes from this life to the next, it is very important that we support the family and friends. We can do this by assisting at the funeral/memorial service. The Funeral/Memorial Team help usher and direct people to the sanctuary; they nicely decorate the tables, if a luncheon is to be catered in the church fellowship hall; they help the caterer in anyway they can. They are also the clean-up crew, along with our custodian, Bill Biscoe. Their job is to make it easy for the family/friends to grieve and to celebrate the life of the loved one. Does this move your spirit? Talk with Helen Weston, Head of the Team, or sign up at the church office.

## **FINANCIAL COUNTERS:**

Do you like to count money? Then this is a ministry for you! It's not your money but the church's money you will count—a very important task because the money is used to further Christ's reach in the world. The Financial Counter Teams (2 usually) ordinarily come to the church building on Monday morning; they count the offering and deposit it in the Eastern Michigan Bank where we have an account. If you like numbers and are a "bean counter," this ministry has been designed for you. We are in need of a few more teams. Please sign up at the church office or talk with Treasurer, Tom Andison.

## **LITURGIST/LAY PREACHER:**

So your gift really is to stand before people and speak clearly the words of God. Yes, that is an awesome task, but a calling even for Lay People. So if you know someone in the congregation that has this gift, approach them and encourage them to sign up for Liturgist or Lay Preacher Training with Pastor Roxie. Or if you are feeling the nudging of the Holy Spirit to venture out and try this, do it! Test it out. You don't have to do both—you can choose. If you are interested, please talk with Pastor Roxie or Jan Hansen who lines up all the Liturgists.

## **ALTAR FLOWERS:**

Why do we have fresh flowers on Sunday morning on the Communion Table? Because aesthetically it helps us to recognize the beauty of God's creation, assisting us in our worship and praise of the God who blesses us with such beauty. There are always opportunities to give a flower donation on any given Sunday. Many times people will donate flowers in recognition of important people in their lives or in celebration of birthdays, anniversaries, or significant events.
