PASTOR'S POINT

From the desk of: Pastor Roxie Davis

Months ago, there I am, standing outside the church building on the front lawn. People are streaming out of the front doors to get into their cars. We are headed to the cemetery to lay the body of Tom Andison to rest; to say our final good-byes to a man who gave so much of his life and energy to this church. As I stand there hugging and shaking people's hands, I notice an amazing sight. It is like "old home week," where people are greeting each other —caring for each other and enjoying the presence of two past pastors, Ron Naylor and Jason Pittman. Both pastors had been invited back to take the lead role in the funeral and in the committal of Tom Andison. I was happy to be the host pastor, allowing them to bring amazing messages of hope for all who believe in lesus Christ.

I realized how much it means to be connected as the Body

of Christ. I experienced how much it means to have the Family of God together, celebrating the life of the deceased and the resurrection of Jesus Christ, especially when past pastors are invited to be a part of the celebration.

So, I have resolved, and I want all of you to know: "As long as I am the pastor of this congregation, there will be permission extended to any family who has lost a loved one, to invite back a past pastor. If you so desire, you are given permission to have them participate in the funeral/memorial/committal service."

I want to experience over and over again, the family reunion that occurs when past pastors return to hug and greet those with whom they ministered together.

Now, I know that this is not the typical practice of the Presbyterian Church, USA, as dictated by the Presbytery of Detroit. The policy is usually, once a pastor leaves, they are not allowed to come back. However, if the current pastor (that's me!) gives permission, a past pastor is allowed to come back. So, here is my blanket "permission" for former pastors to come back. I know this is not typical—but I am not your typical pastor. I have seen too much in my overforty years of pastoral experience, not only as a pastor but also as a Presbytery Executive. We need to demonstrate to each other and to the world that unity means everything; that family (especially the Family of God) is important; and that coming together in a Family Reunion is significant, even if it is at a Funeral/Memorial Service. We, not only celebrate the reality of the resurrection of lesus, but we celebrate our common belief in Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior—Head of the Church. What a joyous event when the "Family of God" can come together—the family of the past and the present.

Thanks be to God!
