PASTOR'S POINT From the desk of: Pastor Roxie Davis

On Sunday, September 17th, after an exciting worship time, I gathered with eight people to talk about the Book of Ecclesiastes, which was the basis of the sermon that day. During the worship service we heard beautiful music from the Muzzarelli Family String Trio, giving us cause to praise God for music in our lives. We also rejoiced in the record number of children (18 in all), who were excited about going to G.I.F.T. (Growing in Faith Together for 4 year olds to 3rd Graders) and Mountain Movers (4th to 8th Graders). In the last three years, this was our largest number of children, anxious to learn about Jesus, on a Sunday morning.

With the joyous worship experience fresh in our minds, the gathering of a group of people to talk about the Book of Ecclesiastes was rich and rewarding. I came away from that study time with two thoughts: First thought: One person in the group inquired, "How can I share my faith more effectively with my family and friends?" Second thought: "How can the church support, not only those who hunger for food, but those who hunger for meaning and purpose in their lives?"

Then on Sunday, September 24th, I read a devotional in the Upper Room (which is graciously offered to you as a devotional resource). The devotional for September 24th was titled: "The Bread of Life." Since I have a profoundly deaf son, Thomas, and a hearingimpaired daughter, Christina, I immediately tuned into the story, written by Jeri Mounier. And I quote: "My daughters and I were excited to attend our first American Sign Language Class at church. Our instructor explained that the sign for Jesus was made by touching a finger to the center of the palm on each hand. This sign signified the scars of Jesus' hands after the

crucifixion. As the class progressed that evening, we began signing the names of foods and various phrases to go along with them. While reviewing, the teacher called on one student to sign, "I am hungry for toast." The student inadvertently signed, "I am hungry for Jesus. "Embarrassed, she laughed and apologized for her mistake. But her confusion was a revelation to me. I am hungry for Jesus in my life. The grace of His forgiveness and love are sustenance that we all yearn for. " End of quote.

In my life and in yours, we hunger for a closer walk with God. But we also see people around us who need Jesus, with the love and forgiveness He offers. Sometimes unbeknownst to them, they are starving, not only for food for their bodies, but they are starving for purpose and meaning in their lives, that only God can fulfill.

By God's grace, as we approach Thanksgiving and Christmas, I will try to help us share Jesus with each other and with those around us. Some of those around us have no idea that their hunger for life's meaning can only be satisfied by faith in God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. I hope to share with you some of the insights that come out of a book, "Holy Moments" written by Matthew Kelly. If you were in worship on October 1st, you should have received the book, "Holy Moments," an early Christmas gift from this church. If you have not been in worship, or missed that Sunday, please come in and receive this gift.

Hopefully, putting "Holy Moments" into action, we will help to transform our lives, the lives of others and change the circumstances around us, for the good. It is all up to God, and our cooperation with the One who made us and calls us into this ministry of love. Thanks be to God.

SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING


The purpose of the meeting was to suspend the By-laws and change the date of the Election Meeting of the Congregation. Nominate and elect Barbara Wright to the Nominating Committee.

- Motion by Dorinne Crowell and supported to dispense the part of the By-laws that states the Election Meeting is held on or before the last Sunday in October, and approve November 12, 2023, for the Election Meeting. This is a one-time change for the meeting date. Motion carried.
- Judith McLean nominated Barbara Wright to serve on the Nominating Committee. There being no further nominations from the floor, the motion was made by Judith and supported to close the nominations and elect Barbara Wright by acclamation. As a member of Session, Barbara will serve as the chair of the committee. Motion carried.

TALES FROM THE YARD SALE

The Mission Committee's annual yard sale, which was held in August, proved to be both a financial and spiritual success. The money raised (more than \$3,000 and counting) will be used to benefit the city's two women's shelters. Pathways and Carolyn's Place, as well as its teen shelter, The Harbor. But more than just money was collected that day and the committee would like to share some of those stories.

- Two women spent several hours going through everything being offered, eventually filling many boxes and bags with home goods. As they were paying for their purchases, they explained that they had been homeless for three years, living in shelters or relying on short-term stays with relatives and friends. But, they had just received a Section 8 voucher (used to subsidize housing), making it possible for them to rent an apartment. They planned to use their purchases to help furnish their new home.
- After filling a small shopping bag with items, a woman found that she had no money with her. She went to put the items back on their tables but was told by one of the helpers that it was not necessary and that she hoped the shopper would enjoy her purchases. The next morning she returned to give us a few dollars for what she had bought.
- A young man selected a toaster oven and a one-cup coffee maker. He was excited to buy them but had no idea how to use the coffee maker. One of our workers walked him through the process. While doing so, he told her that he had just moved into the neighborhood. When he was ready to leave, he pulled out \$10 and asked if that would be enough for the two items. Assured that it was more than enough, he left. As the worker who helped him commented, "It was heartwarming to see him walk away feeling good about his finds and himself."
- A couple spent time selecting as many blankets and coats as they could carry, not caring about sizes, colors or styles. When leaving, they said that they were formerly homeless and that now they spent time going to various garage and yard sales buying blankets and coats that they then donated to various shelters and agencies to distribute to those in need.
- Throughout both days, several people stopped by- not to shop but to simply give us some money. Nearly all of them said they had been formerly homeless and that they wanted to give something back to help others in the same situation.
