

DISCIPLESHIP ADULT STUDY: Wednesday evenings from 6:00-7:30 p.m. We are continuing a six-week study - "Exploring the Way: An Introduction to Spiritual Formation," and this week will be exploring Holy Listening. PENTECOST PC(USA) OFFERING: On Sunday, June 8, the Mission Committee is once again asking you to "pour out your spirit" and show "we are there" for the Presbyterian Mission Agency's annual Pentecost offering. The money we collect will be divided four ways: 40% staying with us to support our own youth ministries, 25% going for the agency's Young Adult Volunteer programs, 25% helping to support national and international youth ministries and 10% going toward the "Educate a Child, Transform the World" national initiative. Last year, First Presbyterian collected \$1,328 with our share (\$498) being used to help support our annual Vacation Bible School/Camp (VBS) program. The money raised this year will also be used for our VBS program.
