PASTOR POINT -From Pastor Kathy

We've been exploring the rhythms in our faith life over the last month – finding spiritual habits that help us grow as Christians, practices that support and sustain us as we live into the image of Christ. Dedicated time focused on God, time spent with Scripture, prayer, nurturing spiritual relationships, ways that we restore ourselves within ourselves and with the external world, and reaching out to others – there are many practices that both challenge us and nurture us.

Life's rhythms around the church year are another practice of re-creating the life and mission of lesus and the church. We have celebrated many church year events in my first 10 months here at First Presbyterian: wrapping up the summer months with our Picnic in the Park; the annual Kirking of the Tartans worship service; Advent and Christmas season; Lent and Easter season. We've supported each other in grieving over loved ones who are no longer with us; we've prayed for each other through sickness and health crises. We look forward to offering it again to the community.

Our Beach Service will start as it did last year – on Father's Day at 8:00 a.m. June 15th, at Lighthouse Beach. This year we will worship around a sermon series I am calling "A Good Beach Read: The Short Stories of Jesus!" Bring your own chair and sunglasses but shoes are optional! We look forward to worshiping God next to our community's greatest natural resource. Of course, we will also continue to worship God at a second service in our Sanctuary at 10:00 a.m. As I round the corner to completing my first full year of ordained ministry and serving you as your minister, I look forward with anticipation to a full beach service season with First Presbyterian!

"POUR OUT YOUR SPIRIT"

In Acts 2:17, Luke writes that on the day of Pentecost, Peter tells his fellow disciples and others who have gathered, "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions and your old men will dream dreams."

On **Sunday, June 8,** the Mission Committee is once again asking you to "pour out your spirit" and show "we are there" for the Presbyterian Mission Agency's annual Pentecost offering.

This offering is dedicated to helping youth build a strong and solid foundation of faith not only within our own congregation and community but nationally and throughout the world. It is collected on the day of Pentecost - the day that Jesus ascends and the church is born - to underscore the message that if his mission and ministry is to continue, it is up to us to keep it going. It is with that in mind that all of the money collected on this day is used to support and create ministries for children, youth and young adults.

The money we collect will be divided four ways with 40% staying with us to support our own youth ministries, 25% going for the agency's Young Adult Volunteer programs, 25% helping to support national and international youth ministries and 10% going toward the "Educate a Child, Transform the World" national initiative.

It is through these gifts that we are given an opportunity to join with other Presbyterians to creatively support and enrich the faith and lives of young people,

Since its inception in 1988, the Pentecost offering has raised nearly \$18 million for ministries benefiting the church's youngest members. Last year, First Presbyterian collected \$1,328 with our share (\$498) being used to help support our annual Vacation Bible School/Camp program. The money raised this year will also be used for our VBS program.
